CASE STUDY: BUILD, OWN, OPERATE, TRANSFER PROJECT

Bangalore, India

In March 2006, Skytanking and its partners, Indian Oil Corporation and Indian Oiltanking, signed a 20-year concession with Bangalore International Airport Limited to build, own and operate the open-access jet-fuel storage and hydrant system for the new airport.

Skytanking has a 33% share and is the technical expert on the project.

Key dates:

- Effective Start Date 2nd March 2006
- Mechanical Completion 15th January 2008
- Operational Readiness 15th March 2008

The facility and airport opened on 24th May 2008.

The fuel facility comprises:

- 3 x 3,300 m³ Jet A-1 tanks
- 4 x 120 m³ / hour truck unloading points
- 7 x 250 m³ / hour hydrant pumps
- 2 x 18" hydrant feeder lines from the fuel farm to the apron
- 4,000 metre hydrant loop, 74 hydrant pits and 6 valve chambers
- Total investment INR 940 million (€17 million)
